

## SCHEDULE 1

### OLYMPIC QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

#### ALPINE SKIING

1. Quota places won for the PyeongChang 2018 Olympic Winter Games (the “**Games**”) are available to the NOC and not to the individual athletes.
2. The total number of quota places available in the Alpine Skiing event is 320. The maximum number of athlete quota places available per NOC is 22, with a maximum of 14 Men and 14 Women quota places available.
3. The maximum quota places available per each of the individual disciplines (Downhill, Super-G, Giant Slalom, Slalom) is 4 athletes per event, with a maximum of one team quota place available in the Mixed Team event.
4. In the event that the NOC qualifies quota places pursuant to the qualification pathways set out in section D of the IOC/ FIS qualification document dated March 2016 (as may be amended from time to time) (“**IOC/FIS Standards**”), and subject to paragraph 6 below, the BOA will only accept as nominations for those quota places any individual(s) who:
  - (i) comply with any eligibility criteria as set out in the IOC/FIS Standards, including (but not limited to) in Section C; and
  - (ii) have achieved two or more of the following: (a) a finish within the top 67% of the field in a World Championships\*; (b) a finish within the top 67% of the field in a World Cup\*; and/or (b) a 40.00 FIS point finish (or better) in a Europa Cup during the period 1 July 2016 – 21 January 2018 (the “**Qualification Period**”); or
  - (iii) have achieved two 40.00 FIS point finishes (or better) in a Europa Cup during the Qualification Period; or
  - (iv) have achieved one 40.00 FIS point finish (or better) result in a Europa Cup and one 35.00 FIS point finish (or better) in a Nor-Am Cup during the Qualification Period.
5. For the avoidance of doubt:
  - a. references to a ‘top 67% finish’ in a World Cup relate to the first run in Giant Slalom and Slalom, and will be based on the number of starters rather than the number of finishers. References to a top 67% finish in a World Championships will be based on the final results of the competition, and will again relate to the number of starters rather than the number of finishers. Qualification races at the World Championships will not be eligible in any event;
  - b. nominations for Alpine Combined will be contingent on the relevant athlete(s) meeting the criteria referred to at 4(i)-(iv) above in respect of either Downhill or Slalom;
  - c. In the event that the NOC qualifies for the Mixed Team event, a maximum of 1 athlete who has not qualified based on 4 (ii)-(iv) above can be selected for the

Mixed Team Event (provided that they comply with 4(i)). However, any such athlete shall not be eligible to compete in any individual events; and

- d. Save as set out in the situations 5(a)-(c) above, athletes shall only be eligible to be nominated in the particular discipline in which they have met the qualification criteria in 4(i)-(iv) above. For example, where an athlete meets the qualification criteria set out in 4(i)-(iv) above in respect of Giant Slalom, such athlete will only be eligible to compete in Giant Slalom.
6. The BOA will not accept as qualification for the Games places offered as Tripartite Commission Invitation places or reallocated unused quota places (i.e. handback places, wildcard places or any other quota places which have not been generated by virtue of a direct qualification) unless agreed by the BOA to be in exceptional circumstances pursuant to the BOA PyeongChang 2018 OQS Policy.
  7. The BOA will consider eligible for selection individual athletes who have been nominated under the BSS Selection Policy for the Games by 22 January 2018.
